

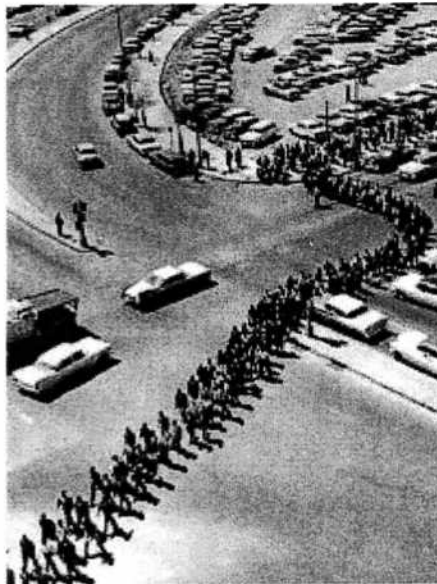
# APRILTEENTH

On April 19, 1960, the home of Z. Alexander Looby was bombed. At the time, Looby was defending the student activists of the sit-in movement in Nashville. The Movement quickly organized the April 19<sup>th</sup> Silent March to City Hall to demand desegregation. 50 years later, Nashville remains plagued by economic, racial, gender, environmental, educational, political, immigration, health, and social injustice. Through nonviolent struggle, we can create a more free, just, and equitable Nashville.
